Required reading:

9th grade

1984, George Orwell

Assignment: Write a 3 - 5 page essay on one of the following topics. Your essay should be double-spaced in 12-point font (Times New Roman). The latest APA formatting guidelines must be used. Use the following resource to assist with APA citations, etc. [owl.english.purdue.edu/owl/section/2/10/]

1. Describe Winston's character as it relates to his attitude toward the Party. In what ways might his fatalistic streak contribute to his ultimate downfall?

2. How does technology affect the Party's ability to control its citizens? In what ways does the Party employ technology throughout the book?

3. Discuss the idea of Rm. 101, the place where everyone meets his or her worst fear. Keep in mind that for the most of Winston's time at the Ministry of Love, he does not know what he will find in Rm. 101. What role does that uncertainty play in making Rm. 101 frightening? Does the cage of rats break Winston's spirit, or does it merely play a symbolic role?

4. What role does Big Brother play within the novel? What effect does he have on Winston? Is Winston's obsession with Big Brother fundamentally similar to or different with O'Brien?

Vocabulary (required)

Go through the novel and choose 25 new vocabulary words. Define them and use them in a sentence.

Study Questions (required)

1. *1984* is full of images and ideas that do not directly affect the plot, but nevertheless attain thematic importance. What are some of those symbols and motifs, and how does Orwell use them?

2. Discuss the idea of doublethink. How important is doublethink to the Party's control of Oceania? How important is it to Winston's brainwashing?

3. Describe Julia's character as it relates to Winston. How is she different from him? How is she similar to him? How does Julia's age make her attitude toward the Party very different Winston's?

11th grade

<u>Assignment</u>: Be able to discuss content of each book. For each book listed, keep a journal recording your thoughts as you read. Write a summary on each book read.

<u>12th grade</u> Hamlet – the play Hamlet – the movie

<u>Assignment</u>: Write a two-paged paper comparing and contrasting the similarities and differences between the movie and the play. Direct citations and quotes from the play must be included when using the book as a comparison.
